







PASSPHRASES

A passphrase is often safer, easier to remember, and simpler to type than a strong password. A passphrase is a series of random words or a sentence.

HOW TO CREATE A STRONG PASSPHRASE

-  Add words together to create a specific phrase
`mydogdoessummersaults`
-  Include capital letters
`MyDogDoesSummersaults`
-  Add spaces to increase complexity when it's an option
`My Dog Does Summersaults`
-  Use some numbers and punctuation
`My Dog Does 47! Summersaults`
-  BLOCK CAPITALS add strength
`MY DOG Does 47! Summersaults`

PASSPHRASE TIPS

-  Use a different passphrase for every account and device.
-  When an answer to a question is required, come up with an answer that is not publicly available.
-  Never share your passphrase strategies.
-  Do not log in to your accounts on a public computer.
-  Consider using a reliable password manager.
-  Use 2-factor authentication whenever possible.
